Folks connected to seniors know about removing throw rugs and emphasizing asking for assistance to reach things in a high cupboard and to use a cane or walker or SOMEONE'S ELBOW when venturing out in the winter but disturbances of balance or sudden weakness or momentary distraction of attention often come into play.

The Prayer Shawl Interest Group continues apace:

- the Shawl donated to Presbytery for a Silent Auction at their last meeting garnered \$50.00.
- so far in 2013, we have presented seven Baptism Shawls and 23 Prayer Shawls for young people and adults. We have three or four baptism Shawls ready for babes on December. 22, 2013.

We all love and value doing this ministry! Besides the obvious, it provides us an opportunity for fellowship and mutual support and fun!

Have receive 12 responses to pastoral care letter sent out with the stewardship package:

This service is open not only to anyone whose loved one has died at the hospital this year but to anyone who needs a quiet, thoughtful time of Word and music amidst the busy-ness.

During this Advent Season, I am quite aware that some of our folks don't have a lot of family or friends nearby, they remember past losses at this time of year or their mobility is restricted by health and weather concerns; so am making many low-key visits to connect folks to the wider Church family. I listen and share laughter and witness a few tears -- no red coat or HoHoHo s --,just talking, listening and praying. Don't get me wrong though, some of the older folks, even most, are wise, content and thinking of others rather than themselves., e.g. was asked to deliver a cheque to Hearthstone office ( re: new nursing home) by someone who has little disposable income.
