Preaching at Rev. Dr. Matthias Ross's covenanting service seems like a long time ago, and I guess that is where I left off! Fulfilling the final duties of the chair of Twin Valleys Presbytery kept me busy at the end of November – with the final service and meeting taking place here at St. Paul's. The Christmas Bazaar, as well as our provincial youth rally came next. I was happy not to have to lead the rally, and could pop by and enjoy time with the youth and leaders that were here.

Advent flew by, with sermons on Imitation, and a very fun one emulating John the Baptists' 'Repent!' In the midst of those was our White Gift/Christmas Hamper (in which we incredibly exceeded expectations!) and Children's Pageant (they did such a wonderful job!!).

Christmas week was as crazy as ever. Jeri-Lee led the service on the December 23, 2018 for Advent IV. Appendix C – Student Minister's Report

January 12, 2019

Happy New Year! Since our last leadership meeting in November I have presided over three services, November 18, 2018, December. 23 2018 and January 6 2019. November 18 2018 I shared my GC43 experience which was fun to briefly relive, and December 23, 2018 had me writing my first baptism service. I joined Jason on Christmas Eve for both services in North Portal and Estevan.

I have met with my Educational Supervisor on the first Friday of December and January. We have discussed that we will continue to meet monthly for at least the first year of my SME, and then re-evaluate how frequently we need to meet. I have been in contact with the new Minister of Vocation and have confirmed that my mid-term evaluation will be due towards the end of February so my LST and I will soon be prepping for that.

November had me continuing to find my feet and get comfortable with the student minister role. I continued to do pastoral care visits and hospital visits and I am beginning to feel more at ease with doing this. December I lead the Advent Bible Study "Awaiting the Already" this book was a big hit for those who attended. The Children's Advent Afternoon was a hit, and very easy to pull off. Throughout December I lent myself out on behalf of the church to many organizations, I put in time at the Angel Tree, The Toy Store and the Christmas Hampers from our auditorium. On my personal time I volunteered with MADD Canada, Hillcrest Elementary and the Salvation Army Kettle. I sure got out there and saw the need of the community this Christmas.

In December I made it to a choir practice, and was quickly inaugurated as their newest member which was unintentional. I have been calling participants from last year's Hospital Visit List and have filled a few slots but looks like I will continue to do the majority of the visiting unless we can get more volunteers. The women's bible study group should be starting up again within the next few weeks. I have been in discussion with Ardelle and we are considering having a bible study that meets out of her house on a weekly basis as she would like to participate in more bible studies and maybe this would draw in others to have a different location then the church.

I have started a complimentary distance course for my DLM studies, 'Hebrew Bible and UCCan Ministry'. My next learning circle will start in the beginning of February with the distance component, this learning circle will focus on Pastoral Care.

The calendar for the Estevan Ministerial Worship services is being finalized, however it appears that most of the dates that are slotted for our Church to provide worship to long term care and the nursing homes will coincide with my

availability, so I look forward to being able to take more of these services on and relieving Jason's responsibility to these worship services.
