A Funeral or Memorial Service offers the opportunity to celebrate the life of your loved one and to reflect on how our faith helps us to have hope even in times of deepest sorrow.



Our ministry at the time of death does not begin or end with the funeral or memorial service. We offer pastoral care before and after the funeral, support and assistance through the sometimes difficult and confusing time of making the necessary arrangements, providing a meaningful service and opportunity for fellowship.

Prior to the Funeral or Memorial service, our minister will meet with you at least once to organize the service itself. Choosing hymns and scripture passages, obtaining personal information and setting the time and place for the service, will be among topics discussed.

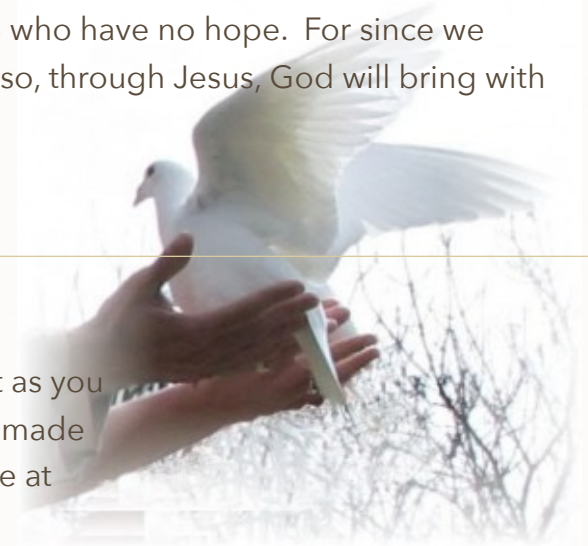
THE APOSTLE PAUL WROTE:

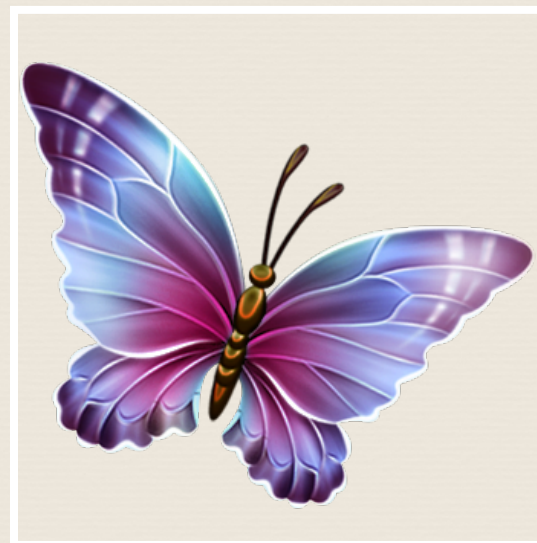
