Annual Congregational Meeting (ACM) High-lights

The report from the Ecumenical Shared Ministry Committee put forward the following recommendations that were accepted by the ACM:

- 1. That the current Ecumenical Shared Ministry Committee continue to meet, cooperating with the leadership teams of all three congregations, to develop recommendations regarding:
 - the **name** for the ecumenical shared ministry - including input from the congregational members,
 - shared **worship practices** all three traditions will be honoured,
 - shared facilities an

extensive assessment of need and value of existing properties will be conducted,

 shared leadership - ministry team including one clergy, able to serve needs of all three denominations, and possibly an additional lay person or clergy based on determined needs, and

- shared operational finances to be determined based on decisions on/ results of above.
- 2. That, in the interim, the current practice of shared worship be on the 4th Sunday of each month, thus increasing to 12 Sundays/year, and that a joint Worship Committee of up to 3 members (including clergy) from each congregation be created to plan these services (possibly including Sunday School), ensuring that all traditions are respected.
- 3. That, in the interim, a Pastoral/ Community Care Committee be formed, with representation from each congregation, to ensure that pastoral care needs (hospital visitation, shut-in visitation, visiting the bereaved) are met for all three congregations and that we work together to help meet the needs of our community.
- 4. That the costs of the use of Trinity Centres Foundation (Founded in 2018, Trinity Centres Foundation is a pan-Canadian charitable organization that was created with the vision of lovingly preserving, restoring, and repurposing underutilized churches into community hubs and affordable housing.), up to \$40,000.00, to support the Ecumenical Shared Ministry Committee and leadership teams of all three congregations in creating a strategy

for the use of the three church buildings that considers wider missional, neighbourhood, community, and charitable objectives.

5. That **a covenant be signed**, including the above recommendations, between the congregations of St. Giles Anglican, St. Paul's United, and Trinity Lutheran and an Ecumenical Shared Ministry be formed.

A big thanks to Diane Wrubleski who has served as Leadership Team chair for the past four years. Her talent and
